

1. **Johann Peters**, b. 25 May 1795 in Insel Chortitza, Chortitza, South Russia (son of Johann Peters), d. 25 Jun 1870 in Franzfeld, Russia. My Heritage claims that Johann died in Franzfeld, Nikolaipol. He married Katharina Schellenberg, b. 3 Nov 1796 (daughter of Paul Gerhard Schellenberg and Sarah Hoewner), d. 14 Sep 1866. Katharina: Could this be the same person as Katharina Schellenberg (b. ca 1792) #529598?
2. **Paul Johann Peters**, b. 6 Sep 1820, d. 14 Aug 1884 in Paulsheim, Yazykovo, South Russia. Paul & Katherina Peters founded the village of Paulsheim, close to Petersdorf. In the 1858 Chortitza Colony Census he is listed at Insel Chortitza #10 or #16. In the 1873 Yazykovo Colony Census he is listed at Petersdorf #4. He married Katharina Peters, 6 Oct 1843 in South Russia, b. 18 Jul 1825 in Rueckenau, Molotschna, South Russia (daughter of Daniel Daniel Peters and Katharina Hamm), d. 26 Jan 1912 in Paulsheim, Yazykovo, South Russia. Katharina: According to one source Katherina and Paul were cousins, in keeping with her father's wish to keep his considerable wealth within the family.
3. **Daniel Peters**, b. 31 Aug 1844 in Petersdorf, Yazykovo, South Russia, d. 17 Sep 1905 in Nikolaifeld, Yazykovo, South Russia. One record says he was born 1 Aug 1844. "The Descendants of Daniel D. Peters, 1794-1879" p 67. The three Dahls that married into this family were siblings. Nikolaipol in the Yazykovo Volost is the Russian form for Nikolaifeld. Gravestone inscription in Nikolaipol cemetery reads: "Daniel Peters; Geboren den 1 Aug. 1844; Gestorben den 17. Sep 1905 Wir preisen selig die erduldet haben ..." Daniel and Aganetha lived in Nikolaipol, the Old Colony. He married Anganetha Friesen, 25 Jan 1868 in Nikolaifeld, Yazykovo, South Russia, b. 25 Apr 1848 in South Russia (daughter of Kornelius Friesen and Elisabeth Penner), d. 10 Dec 1919 in Nikolaifeld, Yazykovo, South Russia. Anganetha: Sister to the other two Friesen in-laws in this family. Son Johann's death registration has mother's name as Agatha Friesen.
4. **Paul Daniel Peters**, b. 14 Nov 1872 in Petersdorf, Yazykovo, South Russia, d. 11 Apr 1953 in Gnadenthal, West Reserve, Manitoba. The connection of Paul and Helena to a son, Johann, is based on logic, not fact. The name Paul is not particularly common in the Mennonite world, so this seems a fairly safe assumption. Johann's obituary indicates that Paul and Helena had at least three daughters and six children. Paul and Helena had ten children (Obituary for Diedrich P. Peters, 1996). Lived at Gnadenthal, Baratov, Ukraine. Their first child, Heinrich P. died in infancy and was not registered as one of their children. He was born and died in 1895. Paul and Helena had 10 children. He married Helena H. Rempel, 1 Dec 1894 in Nikolaifeld, Yazykovo, South Russia, b. 7 Mar 1873 in Nikolaifeld, Yazykovo, South Russia (daughter of Heinrich Rempel and Anna Sawatzky), d. 4 Jun 1951 in Gnadenthal, West Reserve, Manitoba. Helena: CMBoc says she was born 7 May 1873. One record incorrectly says she was born in Chortitza. (Probably meant Chortitza Colony.) One record says she was born at Nikolaipol, South Russia. (This is the Russian name for Nikolaifeld.)
5. **Daniel P. Peters**, b. 17 May 1898 in Gnadental, Baratov, South Russia, d. 27 Jun 1974 in Winkler, Manitoba. Daniel and Maria immigrated to Canada in 1923 with 3 children and lived in Blumenort, MB near Gretna, MB. Daniel had 12 children, 9 daughters and 2 sons of whom 2 daughters died in infancy. Daniel remarried to Agnes Peters of Weidenfeld, Manitoba (Peters, Jennifer, 1994). He married (1) Maria F. Sawatzky, 6 May 1919 in Gnadental, Baratov, South Russia, b. 14 Nov 1897 in Gnadental, Baratov, South Russia (daughter of Franz F. Sawatzky and Margaretha J. Schellenberg), d. 5 Sep 1939 in Morden, Manitoba. Maria: Maria has been linked to this particular Franz & Margaretha Sawatzky based on the probabilities. Helena (Sawatzky) Ens' obituary indicates that she had a sister, Maria Peters, who predeceased her. This particular Maria (Sawatzky) Peters was born just three years later than Helena, in the same Baratow village. Maria was the sister to Margareta Sawatzky (Dietrich P. Peter's wife). Herbert Peters, in his Genealogy of the Daniel D. Peters (1794-1879) clan has this Maria Sawatzky listed as well. He married (2) Aganetha "Agnes" Peters, 10 Nov 1940 in Blumenort, West Reserve, Manitoba, b. 13

Jun 1903 in Weidenfeld, West Reserve, Manitoba (daughter of Johan W. Peters and Maria Wiebe), d. 14 Feb 1996 in Winkler, Manitoba. Aganetha: Joined another church in 1940. Aganetha and Daniel had 3 children, 2 daughters and 1 son.

6. **Maria D. Peters**, (daughter of Daniel P. Peters and Maria F. Sawatzky) b. 24 Apr 1920 in Gnadental, Baratov, South Russia, d. 10 Apr 2007 in Steinbach, Manitoba. Buried in Heritage Cemetery. She married (1) Gerhard Jacob Klassen, 13 Aug 1944 in Blumenort, West Reserve, Manitoba, b. 2 Jul 1914 in Gnadental, Baratov, South Russia (son of Jacob J. Klassen and Margaretha Ens), d. 7 Jan 1950 in Blumenort, West Reserve, Manitoba. Gerhard: His n.s. birth date was 15 Jul 1914. George and his spouse had 6 children, 1 child died before George died. They were married for 5 1/2 years. She married (2) Johann S. Friesen, 17 Dec 1950 in Winkler, Manitoba, b. 4 Mar 1909 in Strassburg, West Reserve, Manitoba (son of Johann J. Friesen and Maria Schmidt), d. 13 Jan 1995 in Steinbach, Manitoba. Johann: Johann's obituary indicates that his wife was born in Gnadenthal while his first two children were born in Rosenort (now Rosetown).
7. **Agnes GRACE Klassen** (details excluded). She married David Franz Loewen, (details excluded).
